At UCLA she received the Caucus for Television Producers, Writers and Director's Foundation Award.

His films have won over 30 international awards including Best First Film at AFI Fest Los Angeles, and the Jury and Audience Awards at Annecy.

FILM EIGHT

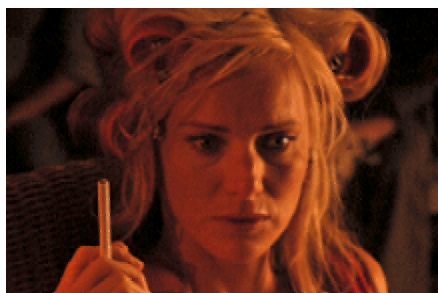
